

## Application for Authorization to Transfer a Net-Metering Certificate of Public Good

**Eligibility.** You may use this form if the ownership of the net-metering system is changing independent from the ownership of the property on which the net-metering system is constructed. (For example, Solar Company A sells a system that is located on a farm to Solar Company B while ownership of the farm is not part of the transaction.) If you are transferring a net-metering Certificate of Public Good (“CPG”) because of a change in ownership of both the property hosting the net-metering system and the system itself, please use the Commission’s Notice of Transfer Form, which is available at <http://puc.vermont.gov/document/transfer-cpg-form>.

**How to file this form.** Please send the completed application to the Public Utility Commission, 112 State Street, 4<sup>th</sup> floor, Montpelier, VT 05620-2701. Copies of the application also must be sent to:

- the Department of Public Service, 112 State Street, 3<sup>rd</sup> floor, Montpelier, VT 05620-2601;
- the Vermont Agency of Natural Resources, Office of Planning and Legal Affairs at 1 National Life Drive, Davis 2, Montpelier, VT 05620-3901, or by e-mail to [ANR.Notice@vermont.gov](mailto:ANR.Notice@vermont.gov);
- the host landowner; and
- the applicant’s electric utility.

**Failure to complete all applicable sections of this application may result in delay or denial.**

**What happens after I file this form?** Upon receipt of the completed form by the Public Utility Commission, the Department of Public Service, and your electric utility, a 14-calendar-day review period will commence.

If no objections are filed with the Public Utility Commission before the 15<sup>th</sup> calendar day after the form was received by the entities listed above, and unless otherwise ordered by the Public Utility Commission, then the application is deemed approved on the next business day. No further correspondence will be required.

If an objection is filed within the 14-calendar-day review period, then the application will **not** be deemed approved. The transfer will not be approved without further action by the Public Utility Commission. In this situation, the Current CPG Holder and the Proposed CPG Holder should await further instructions from the Public Utility Commission.
